### CREATING A NEW ACCOUNT

Before starting, be sure you have your Student's ID Number from the school. If you do not have one yet, contact the school.

1. [Click Here](#) or Visit [www.algomawolves.org](http://www.algomawolves.org) click the Families tab then click eFunds
2. Click on Register Here.
3. Provide requested information.
4. Click Sign Up!
5. Use the Student ID Number along with your student's last name.  
<Student Name> Lunch ID: <Lunch ID>  
Add multiple students at this time if you have more than one child. Click Add.
6. Once all students have been added, click Continue to Account Overview. You are now ready to make a payment.

**NOTE:** You will not need to perform registration in the future. Please remember your username and password for return users.

### VIEW PAYMENT HISTORY

1. Under **Payment Options**, click **View Payment History**.
2. Your past 30-day history will be displayed.
3. Click the drop-down menu on the right to view payments for your current or previous school year.

### PAYMENT METHOD SET UP

1. Under **Payment Options**, click **Make a Payment**
2. Enter your Checking Account OR Credit/Debit Card information.
3. Click **Save**.
4. Return to **Payment**.

### SCHEDULE A ONE-TIME PAYMENT

1. Under **Payment Options**, click **Make a Payment**.
2. Select the student you wish to make a payment for.
3. Enter the dollar amount you would like to deposit for each student.
4. Select the date in which you would like to make your payment.
5. Click **Continue**.
6. Verify your payment information is correct and accept convenience fee(s).
7. Click **Submit**.
8. Print receipt for your records.

### SCHEDULE RECURRING PAYMENTS

1. Under **Payment Options**, click **Schedule a Pre-Authorized Payment**.
2. Select the student you wish to make a payment for.
3. Enter the dollar amount you would like to deposit for each student.
4. Select the date in which you would like to make your payment and repeat frequency.
5. Click **Continue**.
6. Verify your payment information is correct and accept convenience fee(s).
7. Click **Submit**.
8. Print receipt for your records.

### ADD LOW MEAL BALANCE PAYMENTS

1. Under **Advisory Services**, click **Low Meal Balance**.
2. Enter a Minimum Balance and Replenish amount.
3. Check the box under **Notice** to receive emails when your student's account is low.
4. Check the box under **Auto Replenish** to automatically have the **Replenish Amount** added to your student's account when the balance is low.
5. Click **Apply Low Meal Balance Settings**.

### **DOOR COUNTY MARITIME MUSEUM OFFERS FREE KIDS DAYS IN FEBRUARY**

Every Sunday in February, the Door County Maritime Museum in Sturgeon Bay will be offering free admission to children 12 and under with an accompanying paid adult. The DCMM hopes to encourage more children to take interest in the importance of our maritime history.

Kids can take a spin steering the *Elba* through the Sturgeon Bay Canal with the use of the interactive simulator. The *Elba* pilothouse is the actual bridge from the 420-foot stream freighter located in the Horton Gallery. Seven video screens fill the windows and simulate a real-time experience while visitors pilot their way through fog, clouds, and bridges. The wheelhouse's audio environment will include water, birds, Kahlenberg engine sounds and on-board radio traffic to give the impression that the "captain" is actually navigating a ship.

Children and families can explore the four galleries with educational and interactive maritime history. Inside the Peterson Gallery, visitors will find the authentic periscope removed from the *USS Lewis and Clark* (SSBN-644). The fully working periscope allows a full view of the working waterfront and the shipyards nearby. Children will delight in experiencing the view from a real working periscope.

Several interactive games are located throughout the museum, encouraging a hands-on learning experience for children. The Sentinels of the Shore exhibit allows them to get up close and personal with a full-size replica of the Door County Sherwood Point Lighthouse lantern. This 4<sup>th</sup> order Fresnel lens is usually 61 feet in the air. Visitors can see it close-up and examine its multiple layers of glass prisms, designed to concentrate the light and cut through a pitch-black night or thick fog. Also in the Sentinels of the Shore exhibit is the interactive lighthouse map. Both adults and kids can use it to illuminate individual lighthouses and track their beams as well as directing their light

The Door County Maritime Museum is located at 120 N Madison St, Sturgeon Bay ,WI. It is open seven days a week from 10am-4pm. Museum admission is \$10 for adults. Call the museum at (920)743-5958 or visit [www.dcm.org](http://www.dcm.org) for more information.
